To reauthorize Department of Justice programs that combat violence against women, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Violence Against
5 Women Extension Act of 2018”.

6 **SEC. 2. STOP GRANTS.**

7 Section 1001(a)(18) of the Omnibus Crime Control
8 and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (34 U.S.C. 10261(a)(18)),
9 by inserting after “for each of fiscal years 2014 through

1 2018” the following: “, and \$111,000,000 for the period
2 beginning on October 1, 2018, and ending on March 31,
3 2019”.

4 **SEC. 3. GRANTS TO ENCOURAGE ARREST POLICIES AND**
5 **ENFORCEMENT OF PROTECTION ORDERS.**

6 Section 1001(a)(19) of title I of the Omnibus Crime
7 Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (34 U.S.C.
8 10261(a)(19)) is amended by inserting after “ for each
9 of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the following: “, and
10 \$36,500,000 for the period beginning on October 1, 2018,
11 and ending on March 31, 2019”.

12 **SEC. 4. LEGAL ASSISTANCE FOR VICTIMS.**

13 Section 1201(f)(1) of the Violence Against Women
14 Act of 2000 (34 U.S.C. 20121(f)(1)) is amended by insert-
15 ing after “for each of fiscal years 2014 through 2018”
16 the following: “, and \$28,500,000 for the period beginning
17 on October 1, 2018, and ending on March 31, 2019”.

18 **SEC. 5. GRANTS TO SUPPORT FAMILIES IN THE JUSTICE**
19 **SYSTEM.**

20 Section 1301(e) of the Violence Against Women Act
21 of 2000 (34 U.S.C. 12464(e)) is amended by inserting
22 after “for each of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the
23 following: “, and \$11,000,000 for the period beginning on
24 October 1, 2018, and ending on March 31, 2019”.

1 **SEC. 6. SEX OFFENDER MANAGEMENT.**

2 Section 40152(c) of the Violence Against Women Act
3 of 1994 (34 U.S.C. 12311(c)) is amended by inserting
4 after “for each of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the
5 following: “, and \$2,500,000 for the period beginning on
6 October 1, 2018, and ending on March 31, 2019”.

7 **SEC. 7. COURT-APPOINTED SPECIAL ADVOCATE PROGRAM.**

8 Section 219(a) the Crime Control Act of 1990 (42
9 U.S.C. 13014(a)) is amended by inserting after “for each
10 of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the following: “, and
11 \$6,000,000 for the period beginning on October 1, 2018,
12 and ending on March 31, 2019”.

13 **SEC. 8. RURAL DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, DATING VIOLENCE,**

20 on October 1, 2018, and ending on March 31, 2019”.

21 **SEC. 9. GRANTS FOR ENHANCED TRAINING AND SERVICES**

23 Section 40801(b)(5) of the Violence Against Women

5 **AND YOUTH GRANTS.**

8 after “for each of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the
9 following: “, and \$7,500,000 for the period beginning on
10 October 1, 2018, and ending on March 31, 2019”.

11 **SEC. 11. GRANTS TO COMBAT VIOLENT CRIMES ON CAM-**
12 **PUSES.**

13 Section 304(e) of the Violence Against Women and
14 Department of Justice Reauthorization Act of 2005 (34
15 U.S.C. 20125(e)) is amended by inserting after “for each
16 of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the following: “, and
17 \$6,000,000 for the period beginning on October 1, 2018,
18 and ending on March 31, 2019”.

19 **SEC. 12. STUDY CONDUCTED THROUGH THE CENTERS FOR**
20 **DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION.**

21 Section 402(c) of the Violence Against Women and
22 Department of Justice Reauthorization Act of 2005 (42
23 U.S.C. 280b-4(c)) is amended by inserting after “for each
24 of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the following: “, and

1 \$500,000 for the period beginning on October 1, 2018,
2 and ending on March 31, 2019”.

3 **SEC. 13. SAVING MONEY AND REDUCING TRAGEDIES**
4 **THROUGH PREVENTION.**

5 Section 41303(f) of the Violence Against Women Act
6 of 1994 (34 U.S.C. 12463(f)) is amended by inserting
7 after “for each of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the
8 following: “, and \$7,500,000 for the period beginning on
9 October 1, 2018, and ending on March 31, 2019”.

10 **SEC. 14. ADDRESSING THE HOUSING NEEDS OF VICTIMS OF**
11 **DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, DATING VIOLENCE,**
12 **SEXUAL ASSAULT, AND STALKING.**

13 (a) **COLLABORATIVE GRANTS TO INCREASE THE**
14 **LONG-TERM STABILITY OF VICTIMS.**—Section 41404(i) of
15 the Violence Against Women Act of 1994 (34 U.S.C.
16 12474(i)) is amended by inserting after “for each of fiscal
17 years 2014 through 2018” the following: “, and
18 \$2,000,000 for the period beginning on October 1, 2018,
19 and ending on March 31, 2019”.

20 (b) **GRANTS TO COMBAT VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN**
21 **IN PUBLIC AND ASSISTED HOUSING.**—Section 41405(g)
22 of the Violence Against Women Act of 1994 (34 U.S.C.
23 12475(g)) is amended by inserting after “for each of fiscal
24 years 2014 through 2018” the following: “, and

1 \$2,000,000 for the period beginning on October 1, 2018,
2 and ending on March 31, 2019”.

14 et seq.) (commonly known as the “Indian Civil Rights Act
15 of 1968”) is amended by inserting after “for each of fiscal
16 years 2014 through 2018” the following: “, and
17 \$2,500,000 for the period beginning on October 1, 2018,
18 and ending on March 31, 2019,”.

19 **SEC. 17. ANALYSIS AND RESEARCH ON VIOLENCE AGAINST**
20 **INDIAN WOMEN.**

21 Section 905(b)(2) of the Violence Against Women
22 and Department of Justice Reauthorization Act of 2005
23 (28 U.S.C. 534 note) is amended by inserting after “for
24 each of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the following: “,

1 and \$500,000 for the period beginning on October 1,
2 2018, and ending on March 31, 2019.”.

3 **SEC. 18. STALKER DATABASE.**

4 Section 40603 of the Violence Against Women Act
5 of 1994 (34 U.S.C. 12402) is amended by inserting after
6 “for each of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the fol-
7 lowing: “, and \$1,500,000 for the period beginning on Oc-
8 tober 1, 2018, and ending on March 31, 2019”.

9 **SEC. 19. FEDERAL VICTIM ASSISTANTS REAUTHORIZATION.**

10 Section 40114 of the Violence Against Women Act
11 of 1994 (Public Law 103–322; 108 Stat. 1910) is amend-
12 ed by inserting after “for each of fiscal years 2014
13 through 2018” the following: “, and \$500,000 for the pe-
14 riod beginning on October 1, 2018, and ending on March
15 31, 2019”.

20 Section 399P(g) of the Public Health Service Act (42
21 U.S.C. 280g-4(g)) is amended by inserting after “for each
22 of fiscal years 2014 through 2018” the following: “, and
23 \$5,000,000 for the period beginning on October 1, 2018,
24 and ending on March 31, 2019”.
