Dear Governor Hochul:

I write to express concern as flash flooding devastated communities across upstate New York and the North Country over the past few weeks, damaging public infrastructure, family homes, and small businesses. During this event, I have been in touch with local officials and residents who were severely impacted by these recent storms and have seen the devastation firsthand as they now work to coordinate the recovery. These recent storms occurred over multiple weeks, leaving many of these communities with exacerbated damage to their critical infrastructure. As damage assessment and recovery efforts are moving forward, I believe it is critical for the State of New York to work to ensure full restoration for the families, businesses, and neighborhoods affected by these disasters.

Between July 1st and 2nd, Northern Tier communities in Clinton County suffered major damages. The Town of Ellenburg estimates hundreds of thousands of dollars in damages, townowned roads were compromised, and the Blue Haven Family Campground was flooded and evacuated. The Town of Dannemora declared a state of emergency to deal with the flooding and its devastating impact on roads and property. These storms continued further, with severe flooding also occurring between July 10th and 11th, further portions of our region were impacted, including the Town of Long Lake where a dam breach resulted in State Route 28, the main road between Long Lake and the Town of Newcomb, being severely damaged. The Town of Saranac had large portions of a critical road connecting the town with the rest of the region which now face weeks, and potentially months, of repairs. Municipalities around the region face similar large-scale and resource-intensive infrastructure repairs.

As the representative for many of these communities affected, while New York State works through the disaster assessment and declaration process and your office communicates with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) regarding a federal disaster request, I strongly urge you to coordinate closely with all local communities affected and ensure their needs are fully addressed in both New York State and FEMA disaster aid. Aid to all affected is essential to a full recovery, and upstate New York and the North Country cannot be left out of this essential process. Given that your initial request to FEMA neglected to include the July 1st and 2nd
